Light the Path in Honour of Children's Grief Awareness Day November 17th 2022

Every November, communities around the world pause to honour children's grief.

It is estimated that 4% of young people will be bereaved of a parent or primary caregiver before the age of 19. In Calgary alone, this represents over 12,000 young people! This does not account for the many more who grieve the deaths of siblings, friends, and other significant people in their lives. The Children's Grief Centre's annual *Light the Path* event has become a meaningful gathering for children and their families.



Recognizing that we all grieve differently, our Children's Grief Centre invites family members to quietly remember their person and engage with other families as they add their candlelit paper lanterns to the path. Last year's event had impromptu races, flashlight tag, and fun on the jungle gym. *Light the Path* participants gather to enjoy treats, hot chocolate, and heartfelt laughs around a cozy fire.

On **November 17th**, we look forward to lighting the path in unison with other landmarks like the Olympic Plaza and CN Tower (both will be lit blue) to recognize this special day.



Celebrating the Living With Cancer Program

It is with a heavy heart we share that our *Living with Cancer Program* came to an end in September. The program started as "Day Program" in 1993 and was the first of its kind in Western Canada. Today we look back with pride and celebrate almost 30 years of the program!

In its full glory, the program hosted around 30 people every Wednesday for 50 weeks of the year. Our living room was filled with people coming together to talk about the hard stuff but also breaking bread, laughing, singing, and sharing. It was a program like none other - award winning, and with a rich history, and vibrant memories. The decision to end the program was not easy and nor was it quick. To make a long story short, the program's enrollment suffered significantly since the start of the pandemic. This is due to a number of variables.

In the spirit of change, we look forward to the blossoming of some new programming offered through our Living with Advanced Illness Centre. We are very excited to start a *Companion Program* which will match volunteers with clients and provide practical and emotional support to clients and families out in the community. We will also be offering spiritual health support and increased counselling services. As we have learned over the 30+ of serving our community, we never know what lies ahead. In the meantime we look forward to serving in new and different ways.

One of our nurses shared her thoughts on our traditions:

"I love the moments at work where I get to pass by the chapel and see the beautiful tree and white lights. I was once told that Christmas lights are a way of guiding workers home to their safe place after a long, cold winter's day - those lights in the chapel absolutely feel that way.

The activities laid out through the holiday months are a great way to reflect on the year. We remember the patients and families and the ways we can help ease the difficulties of death and dying.
