New Name, Same Services!

Our Community Hospice Services will soon become the Living with Advanced Illness Centre!

us this name is confusing and doesn't accurately describe the services offered.

We are excited to share that we heard your feedback and will be changing the name to the *Living with Advanced Illness Centre*! These services will continue to be a part of Hospice Calgary, along with the Children's Grief Centre and Rosedale Hospice.

What does this mean for the community?

Often when people hear the word "hospice", they think of a residential hospice only. With our new name, the *Living with Advanced Illness Centre*, people will know that they can call us for support much earlier in their illness; not just at end of life. The Centre's mission will be to continue to provide a family-centred, integrated, community-based approach to improved quality of life for those impacted by advanced illness. The *Living with Advanced Illness Centre* offers:

- Care and support beyond the bedside
- A place for difficult conversations about advanced illness
- Tools to help with grief
- Commitment towards building compassionate communities

We hope that this new name shares our goal to help people live well during illness and encourage them to play an active role in their care, connect with others, and get support for their emotional, physical, and spiritual needs, as well as gain practical knowledge to help with their journey.

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The Children's Grief Centre Doors are Open!

Like schools, community support agencies, and most businesses, we have had a mix of online-only services, hybrid online & restricted in-person services during the past 18 months.

We're happy to share that our doors have been open for the last few weeks to all our families. We will continue to offer a hybrid model of counselling and supports at our Children's Grief Centre, in schools and the community, and online to best support our clients, remove barriers to service, and maintain public health requirements.

Our Village monthly drop-in group resumes this fall and we plan to run our Kids Club groups (children in grades 1-6) and Common Ground groups (teens in grades 7-12) in the new year. You can find the latest information on our groups on the website: childrensgriefcentre.ca.

A new resource coming soon: Grief In My Backpack

We are excited to share with you that we are in the process of developing a new and more extensive school resource which will replace our *Good Grief: Supporting the Grieving Student* publication.

In March 2021, we sought input from teachers, school counsellors, school administrators, family support workers, and educational support staff as to what they needed and wished for, to better support grieving students. These surveys were sent to school personnel in different school districts in Alberta. Respondents of these surveys indicated that a school-specific grief resource would be helpful when responding to the needs of students who are grieving.

This new resource will include information about grief and how it shows up; how to support grieving students; creating compassionate classrooms; and some suggestions for protocols and processes to respond to news of illness or death in the school. It will feature stories through images, writing, videos, etc. *Grief in my Backpack* will be an online resource. We will also have a printed quick reference guide available.
