brother's legacy through what he calls his "charitable impulse". He is "blown away" by the services at Hospice Calgary, especially the Children's Grief Centre. Maybe that's because Al is a former high school principal and teacher!

Al was born in Winnipeg and one of 4 children. He lived in many places growing up and eventually made Calgary his home with wife, Bernie, and their 2 daughters who are, as a proud father he shares, "very successful".

Al volunteers his time to make amazing culinary treats for our staff. He regularly drops off batches of warmfrom-the-oven cookies to our offices. This past year he also treated our staff to 4 course home-cooked hot lunches exquisitely prepared and equally tasty. He does this because he feels it's important that staff get personal recognition for the work they do – something he remembers being meaningful when he and his staff at schools would be recognized by parents.

Jim Button was well-known and well-loved for his work throughout the Calgary community. He was a co-founder of Village Brewery and a leader in the marketing world for over 30 years. He has been recognized by the Top 40 under 40 awards and the Canadian Association of Fundraising Professionals.

In November 2022, Jim's battle with advanced cancer brought him to Rosedale Hospice. Many of the memories he created at our hospice are documented on his blog *Gather With Jim*. In the blog, Jim shares an incredible experience he had this past New Years' Eve.

Jim, his wife Tracey, and two other couples celebrated New Year's Eve in the Rosedale Hospice Fireplace Lounge. The three couples dined on Greek food from nearby Santorini's restaurant and talked for hours.

Jim and Tracey reserved the hospice guest room as a sanctuary for them to privately welcome in the new year. They were treated to a honeymoon-style setup from our team – complete with chocolates and champagne. For the first time in months, Jim and Tracey spent the night together in the same bed and in each other's arms, celebrating the start of 2023.

We know that spending time in a hospice can be challenging for families, especially so during the holidays. The staff and volunteers at Rosedale Hospice spend a great deal of time getting to know our patients and their family members. They do this not only to provide exceptional medical care but also to offer personalized experiences and beautiful family memories.

Call for Volunteers: Telephone Grief Support


