Intake Coordinator – Permanent, Full-Time

The Intake Coordinator position is a critical role supporting the Children's Grief Centre and the Living with Advanced Illness Centre. It is the initial point of contact and assessment for people seeking short and long-term grief and trauma-focused counselling. The Intake Coordinator provides essential support with compassion and provides grief-specific information and guidance during intake. This role also acts as a key resource for community professionals and program support for the Children's Grief Centre clinical team.

What We Require

- A degree or diploma in social work, child and youth care, or similar field
- Minimum 2 years experience in human services field
- Alignment with Hospice Calgary's values as well as philosophy of hospice and grief care
- Experience with children, teens, and families
- Demonstrated skills for screening, assessment, documentation, case management, service coordination
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills
- Familiar with Calgary and area mental health resources; ability to support system navigation and referrals
- Committed to ongoing learning and professional development
- Valid driver's license with own transportation
